Science: Draw a diagram of the particles in a pure substance and a mixture. Explain the difference between the two.

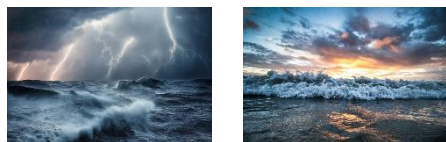

English: Write a setting description of a stormy sea. How many examples of figurative language can you include?



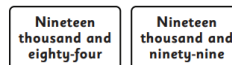
Geography: Research and list natural resources that come from the UK. Make sure to ask an adult if researching online.
