Features of Text Type: Poetry

In poetry, end of line punctuation, such as a comma or a full stop, is used to support rhythm and performance. Features of Text Type: Recounts

Recounts are written to retell a series of real or imaginary events.

Events are usually recounted in the first person using the personal pronoun 'I'.

Events are recounted in **chronological order** using '**sequencing language**' (such as adverbs of time) to guide the reader through the text.
